How the Program Works

- 1. **Register** at <u>fauquierlibrary.org/services/kids/</u> or at any Fauquier Public Library location, then **pick up a reading log** at your local library or download one at fauquierlibrary.org.
- 2. Color a square on the log for **every book you read**. Even rereading the same titles counts, so read and color away!
- 3. After you've read 100 books bring your log into the library to receive a reward and your next log.



- 4. When you reach 1,000 books you'll receive a certificate and special book bag. We'll also post your picture on our **Wall of Fame**.
- 5. If you prefer to use an online tool to track titles you may download the **1000 Books Before Kindergarten app** in the App Store (iPhone) or Google Play (Android).
